A: 2 Phases: Training & Maintenance

Training

students the task	"We're going to learn something called Power Position."	
looks and sounds	"When I ask you to get into Power Position, it means you'll"	
the behavior	"Let me show you what that looks and sounds like."	
the behavior	"Let's try this together. I'll watch for kids who remember how it looks and sounds ."	
(praise/correct)	"That was great following directions!" and /or "Let's try that part again."	

Hmmm... If only there were an acronym for this...

VIDEO: Teaching Power Position

Notice how important it is for students to learn to attend before any other expectations are taught
